Dear Senate Majority Leader Schumer, Minority Leader McConnell, Chair Cantwell and Ranking Member Wicker:

We represent a wide cross section of businesses, consumer advocates, civil rights organizations, education sector, state and local elected officials, and community groups urging you to bring to the floor the confirmation vote of Gigi Sohn for the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) before Congress adjourns. Her nomination is supported by a vast array of public interest and civil society organizations, broadband providers, wireless carriers, technology companies, public safety, rural and Tribal entities seeking to bring broadband to these communities, as well as government leaders from both Democratic and Republican administrations. The FCC needs a full commission as it begins to deliberate on upcoming critical decisions that will have profound impacts on the economy and the American people.

Over Ms. Sohn's 30 years of experience in telecommunications, broadband and technology policy, she has shown a strong commitment to the First Amendment, and proven to be a leader in promoting innovation, US jobs and a strong economy. She has regularly worked with organizations representing diverse media interests and across the aisle to ensure all voices and views are heard both as a consumer advocate and as a government official. Her consistent and long held support of diversity in viewpoints in media will serve all voices well and is why she is supported by both conservatives and progressives.

Ms. Sohn has also worked extensively during her career to expand broadband access to those who can't afford it. Her work with industry and members of Congress in developing programs which support low-income Americans including those in rural and tribal lands, is an example of her commitment to work with all sides to arrive at commonsense solutions. With the FCC having been tasked by Congress to ensure all Americans gain access to open, affordable, 21st century ready broadband service under the bipartisan infrastructure law, the agency will benefit from Ms. Sohn's involvement as it works to expand work and business opportunities to Americans in unserved and underserved areas.
